CONSENT ORDER

Respondent.

The State of Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") has received evidence that Ronald M. Rosenfeld ("Respondent" or "Rosenfeld") violated provisions of Title 20, Arizona Revised Statutes. Respondent wishes to resolve this matter without the commencement of formal proceedings, and admits the following Findings of Fact are true and consents to entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On March 8, 2007, Rosenfeld applied for an Arizona non-resident producer license for the life and accident/health/sickness lines of authority. Rosenfeld submitted his application through the National Association of Insurance Commissioners ("NAIC") online system called NIPR.
- 2. Rosenfeld's addresses of record with the Department are: 2 Plantingfield Rd., Roslyn Heights, New York 11577 (residence); 585 Stewart Ave., Suite 318, Garden City, New York 11530 (business and mailing).
- 3. In the "Background Questions" section of the application, Question 2 asks: Have you or any business in which you are or were an owner, partner, officer or director, or member or manager of a limited liability company, ever been involved in an administrative

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proceeding regarding any professional or occupational license, or registration. Rosenfeld responded "No" to the question.

4. On October 24, 2006, the State of New York Insurance Department filed an administrative action against Rosenfeld for demonstrating lack of fitness or trustworthiness for authorizing the use of his name by another agent for purposes of assisting that other agent in the disguising of the sale of a life insurance policy as if the policy had been sold in another state, when in fact, it had been sold in New York by an insurer not licensed to do business in New York. The State of New York Insurance Department fined Rosenfeld \$750.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Director has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Respondents' conduct as described above constitutes providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete or materially untrue information in the license application, within the meaning of A.R.S. §20-295(A)(1).
- 3. Respondent's conduct as described above constitutes demonstrating incompetence, untrustworthiness or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business in this state or elsewhere, within the meaning of A.R.S. §20-295(A)(8).
- 4. Grounds exist for the Director to suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew Respondent's insurance license, impose a civil penalty and/or order restitution pursuant to A.R.S. §§20-295(A) and (F).

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

Rosenfeld shall pay a \$100 civil penalty to the Department.
