The State of Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") has received evidence that **Erendira Arguelles** ("Respondent") has violated provisions of Title 20, Arizona Revised Statutes ("A.R.S."). Respondent wishes to resolve this matter without the commencement of formal proceedings, and admits the following Findings of Fact are true and consents to entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent is, and was at all material times licensed as a resident credit producer, Arizona license number 884363 which expires December 31, 2010.
- 2. Respondent's mailing, business and residence addresses of record with the Department are: CitiFinancial, 1229 S. Power Rd., #107, Mesa, Arizona 85206 (business and mailing) and 6834 E. Portia St., Mesa, Arizona 85207 (residence).
- 3. On or about February 1, 2007, the Department issued to Respondent an insurance license as a resident credit producer, Arizona license number 884363.
- 4. On June 12, 2007, the Department notified Respondent by mail at her business address of record that her fingerprint card had been processed and returned by the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI") as illegible. The Department requested a replacement set of fingerprints along with a completed "Illegible Fingerprint Replacement Form" on or before July 13, 2007.

- 5. On August 3, 2007, the Department sent a second letter to Respondent at her business address of record, return receipt requested, and her residence address of record notifying her that she had fifteen (15) days to submit a full set of fingerprints to the Department.
- 6. On August 10, 2007, the Post Office returned the signed green card for the August 3, 2007 letter to Respondent's business address of record.
- 7. To date, Respondent has not submitted a full set of fingerprints to the Department.
- 8. On November 8, 2007, the Department set a hearing and issued a Notice of Hearing for revocation of Respondent's license.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Director has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Respondent's conduct as described above constitutes the violation of the requirement that an applicant submit a full set of fingerprints to the Department within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-285(F)(2).
- 3. Respondent's conduct as described above constitutes providing incomplete information in the license application within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-295(A)(1).
- 4. Respondent's conduct as described above constitutes the violation of any provision of A.R.S. Title 20 or any rule, subpoena or order of the director within the meaning of A.R.S.§20-295(A)(2).
- 5. Grounds exist for the Director to suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew Respondent's insurance license, impose a civil penalty and/or order restitution pursuant to A.R.S. §§20-295(A) and (F).

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ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1. Respondent shall immediately submit to the Department a full set of fingerprints and an Illegible Fingerprint Replacement Form.
- Respondent shall immediately pay to the Department a civil money penalty in the amount of \$100.
- 3. The hearing, Docket # 07A-193-INS, scheduled for January 7, 2008 at 9:00 a.m. is vacated.
