In the Matter of the Docket No. 08A-011-INS Surrender of the Certificate of Authority of Transcontinental Insurance Company (NAIC No. 20486), Petitioner.

ORDER

Based upon reliable evidence provided to the Director of Insurance by the Assistant Director of the Financial Affairs Division of the Department of Insurance, the Director finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Petitioner, Transcontinental Insurance Company, NAIC No. 20486, is a foreign insurer domiciled in New York. Petitioner received its certificate of authority to transact property and casualty insurance in Arizona on January 1, 1955.
- 2. Effective December 31, 2007, Petitioner, the non-surviving entity, merged into National Fire Insurance Company of Hartford (NFICH), NAIC No. 20478, the surviving entity, a foreign insurer domiciled in Illinois. The surviving entity is authorized to transact insurance in Arizona. Petitioner has voluntarily surrendered its certificate of authority to Director.

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- 3. On December 7, 2007, the Insurance Commissioner of New York approved the merger of Petitioner into NFICH.
- 4. Petitioner has no obligations under any policy of insurance to any policyholders or claimants who are residents of Arizona.
- 5. Petitioner is not the subject of any pending investigation or market conduct examination, and Petitioner does not owe this Department any filings or fees.
- 6. The Department holds a Workers' Compensation deposit in the amount of \$850,000 on behalf of the Petitioner.
- 7. Petitioner has deposited \$100.00 which has been credited to the Insurance Examiners' Revolving Fund ("IERF") pursuant to A.R.S. § 20-159.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Petitioner has complied with the provisions of A.R.S. § 20-217 and with A.A.C. R20-6-303, relating to the surrender of its Certificate of Authority.

ORDER

- 1. The surrender of the Petitioner's certificate of authority is accepted.
- 2. The Workers' Compensation deposit of the Petitioner in the amount of \$850,000 shall be transferred to an account in the name of NFICH with the Department, and shall be held as a Workers' Compensation deposit of NFICH.
- 3. The \$100.00 deposited by Petitioner which has been credited to the IERF shall be released to Petitioner.
