The State of Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") has received evidence that **Gene Avery Brigner** violated provisions of Title 20, Arizona Revised Statutes.

Respondent wishes to resolve this matter without the commencement of formal proceedings, and admits the following Findings of Fact are true and consent to entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- Gene Avery Brigner ("Brigner" or "Respondent") is, and was at all material times licensed as an Arizona resident accident/health and life producer, Arizona license number 909279, which expires November 30, 2011.
- Brigner's addresses of record are: 208 N. Wickiup St., Apache Jct., Arizona
 85219 (business, mailing and residence).
- 3. On December 31, 2007, Brigner submitted an Application for an Individual Insurance License to the Department. Section VII of the application asks: A. Have you ever been convicted of a felony? Brigner answered "No" and signed the application.
- 4. On November 30, 1984, the State of Michigan 14th Circuit Court entered an "Order of Probation" in State of Michigan v. Gene Avery Brigner, Docket No. 84-25949-FH ("Order"). The Order found Brigner guilty of Attempted Embezzlement by Agent over \$100.

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Felony, a felony conviction. The court placed Brigner on 5 years of probation. On June 27, 1988, in the same case, the court entered a "Judgment of Sentence – Commitment to Jail" ("Judgment"). The Judgment found Brigner guilty of Probation Violation (Embezzelment (sic) by Agent). The court ordered Brigner incarcerated and to be placed on probation for 5 years. On January 13, 1994, the court entered a "Petition and Order for Discharge from Probation."

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Director has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete or materially untrue information on the license application, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-295(A)(1).
- 3. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes having been convicted of a felony, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-295(A)(6).
- 4. Grounds exist for the Director to suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew Respondent's insurance license, impose a civil penalty and/or order restitution pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 20-295(A) and (F).

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

 Respondent shall immediately pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$100 for deposit into the state general fund.

- 6. Respondent acknowledges that this Consent Order is an administrative action that will be reported to the NAIC and that he may have to report this administrative action on any future licensing applications either to the Department or other states' Departments of Insurance.
