**CONSENT ORDER** 

The State of Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") has received evidence that Scott Alan Ennis has violated provisions of Title 20, Arizona Revised Statutes. Respondent wishes to resolve this matter without the commencement of formal proceedings, and admits the following Findings of Fact are true and consents to entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

# FINDINGS OF FACT

- Scott Alan Ennis ("Respondent") is, and was at all material times, licensed as an 1. Arizona resident bail bond agent, Arizona license number, 905937, which expires on August 31, 2011.
- Respondent's addresses of record are: c/o Easy Bail Bonds, LLC, 3012-3014 N. 2. 16<sup>th</sup> Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85016 (business and mailing), 54 Dow Street, New London, CT 06320 (residence).
- 3. On or about December 15, 2008, Respondent entered into a Consent Agreement, Stipulation and Final Order with the State of Connecticut Insurance Department: In the Matter of Scott Ennis, Docket No: LI 08-123 ("First Consent Agreement"). The First Consent Agreement ordered Respondent to pay a \$3,500 fine, placed him on probation for 1

year, required Respondent to file a written report of his insurance activities every six months and stipulated that a violation of the First Consent Agreement would result in immediate suspension of Respondent's Connecticut bail bond producer's license.

- 4. On or about June 8, 2009, Respondent entered into a Consent Agreement,
  Stipulation and Final Order with the State of Connecticut Insurance Department: In the Matter
  of Scott A. Ennis, Docket No: LI 09-32 ("Second Consent Agreement"). The Second Consent
  Agreement found that Respondent had failed to return collateral in a timely manner and failed
  to act in a trustworthy or financially responsible manner in two instances. The Second
  Consent Order revoked Respondent's bail bond producer license in Connecticut.
- 5. Respondent did not report either the First Consent Agreement or the Second Consent Agreement to the Department within 30 days..

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The Director has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes failing to report an administrative action taken against the producer in any other jurisdiction, within the meaning of A.R.S.§20-301(A) as applied to bail bond agents under A.R.S. § 20-340.06.
- 3. Respondent's' conduct, as described above, constitutes the violation of any provision of Title 20 or any rule, subpoena or order of the Director, within the meaning of A.R.S.§20-295(A)(2) as applied to bail bond agents under A.R.S. § 20-340.06.
- 4. Grounds exist for the Director to suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew Respondent's insurance license, pursuant to A.R.S. §§20-295(A) as applied to bail bond agents under A.R.S. § 20-340.06.

5. Grounds exist for the Director to order Respondent to pay, in addition to any suspension, revocation or refusal to renew, a civil penalty of not more than two hundred fifty dollars for each unintentional failure or violation, up to an aggregate civil penalty of two thousand five hundred dollars or a civil penalty of not more than two thousand five hundred dollars for each intentional failure or violation, up to an aggregate civil penalty of fifteen thousand dollars, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-295(F) as applied to bail bond agents under A.R.S. § 20-340.06.

#### **ORDER**

# IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent shall immediately pay a civil penalty to the Department of \$500.00 for deposit into the State General Fund.
