The State of Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") has received evidence that **Juan Esteban Ordonez** ("**Respondent**") violated provisions of Title 20, Arizona Revised Statutes. Respondent wishes to resolve this matter without the commencement of formal proceedings, and admits the following Findings of Fact are true and consents to entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent is, and was at all material times, licensed as an Arizona resident adjuster, Arizona license number 1075068, which expires on January 31, 2018. Respondent first became licensed with the Department on April 18, 2014.

FAILURE TO NOTIFY

3. On or about March 16, 2016, in the Superior Court of Arizona, Maricopa County ("Court"), the Court held an Initial Pretrial Conference in State of Arizona v. Juan Ordonez, CR2015-002707 ("CR2015-002707").

4. Respondent failed to notify the Department of the criminal prosecution in writing within thirty days of the initial pretrial hearing date.

FELONY CONVICTION

5. On or about October 4, 2016, the Court in CR2015-002707 filed a Suspension or Sentence – Probation Granted finding Respondent guilty of two counts of felony theft. The Court also ordered restitution in the amount of \$10,982.64.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Interim Director has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes failing to notify the director any criminal prosecution of the producer taken in any jurisdiction within thirty days after the initial pretrial hearing date, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-301(B) as applied to adjusters under A.R.S. § 20-321.02.
- 3. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes violating any provision of Title 20, or any rule, subpoena or order of the director, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-295(A)(2) as applied to adjusters under A.R.S. § 20-321.02.
- 4. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes having been convicted of a felony, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-295(A)(6) as applied to adjusters under A.R.S. § 20-321.02.
- 4. Grounds exist for the Interim Director to deny, suspend for not more than twelve months, revoke, or refuse to renew an insurance producer's license pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 20-295(A) and 20-321.02.

Respondent further acknowledges that he must report this administrative action to any and all states in which he holds an insurance license and must disclose this administrative
