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CONSENT ORDER

Docket No. 16A-171-INS

The State of Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") has received evidence that **PERLA M. MORALES** violated provisions of Title 20, Arizona Revised Statutes. Respondent wishes to resolve this matter without the commencement of formal proceedings, and admit the following Findings of Fact are true and consent to entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- Perla M. Morales ("Morales" or "Respondent") is, and was at all material times, 1. licensed as an Arizona resident personal lines (P&C) insurance producer, Arizona license number 1145698, which expires April 30, 2020. Respondent first became licensed with the Department on May 2, 2016.
- Respondent's address of record is: 1920 E. Coronado St., Phoenix, Arizona 2. 85006 (business and mailing).
- On or about May 2, 2016, Respondent submitted an application for an individual 3. resident license to the Department ("Application"). Question 1B of the application's background questions asks: Have you ever been convicted of a felony, had a judgment

withheld or deferred, or are you currently charged with committing a felony? You may exclude juvenile adjudications (offenses where you were adjudicated delinquent in a juvenile court).

Respondent answered "No" to Question 1B.

4. Respondent accepted the attestation on the application, certifying that, under penalty of perjury, all of the information submitted in the application and attachments is true and complete.

Felony Conviction

5. On or about January 6, 2011, the Superior Court of Arizona, Maricopa County, entered a Suspension of Sentence – Probation Granted in State of Arizona v. Perla Morales, CR2010-131207 ("Case CR2010-131207"). The Court in Case CR2010-131207 found Respondent guilty of Money Laundering in the Second Degree, a Class 6 undesignated felony, and ordered Respondent placed on probation for one year.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Interim Director has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete or materially untrue information in the license application, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-295(A)(1).
- 3. Grounds exist for the Interim Director to deny, suspend for not more than twelve months, revoke, or refuse to renew an insurance producer's license pursuant to A.R.S. § 20-295(A).
- 4. Grounds exist for the Interim Director, in addition to or instead of any suspension, revocation or refusal to renew, impose a civil penalty of not more than two hundred fifty dollars for each unintentional failure or violation, up to an aggregate civil penalty of two thousand five hundred dollars, or impose a civil penalty of not more than two thousand five hundred dollars for

bach intentional failure or violation, up to an aggregate civil penalty of fifteen thousand dollars, 1 within the meaning of to A.R.S. § 20-295(F). 2 3 ORDER IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT: 4 Perla M. Morales shall pay a civil penalty of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). 1. 5 Payment shall be due upon the submission of this Consent Order. 6 2. Respondent is aware of her right to notice and a hearing at which she may be 19 represented by counsel, present evidence and examine witnesses. Respondent irrevocably 20 waives her right to such notice and hearing and to any court appeals relating to this Consent 21 Order. 22 23 24

- 4. Respondent states that no promise of any kind or nature whatsoever, except as expressly contained in this Consent Order, was made to induce her to enter into this Consent Order and that she has entered into this Consent Order voluntarily.
- 5. Respondent acknowledges that the acceptance of this Consent Order by the Director is solely to settle this matter against her and does not preclude any other agency, officer, or subdivision of this state including the Department from instituting civil or criminal proceedings as may be appropriate now or in the future not related to this matter.
- 6. Respondent acknowledges that this Consent Order is an administrative action that the Department will report to the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC). Respondent further acknowledges that she must report this administrative action to any and all states in which she holds an insurance license and must disclose this administrative action on any license application.
