CONSENT ORDER

The State of Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") has received evidence that Angelica Christine Anderson has violated provisions of Title 20, Arizona Revised Statutes ("A.R.S."). Respondent wishes to resolve this matter and admits the following Findings of Fact are true and consents to entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Angelica Christine Anderson ("Respondent") is and was at all material times licensed as a resident insurance producer with lines of authority in property and casualty insurance, National Producer Number 18559058, which expires January 31, 2021.
2. Respondent's addresses of record with the Department are: 5601 N. Oracle Rd., Tucson, AZ 85704 (business), 7681 N. Camino De Maximillian, Tucson, AZ 85704 (mailing) and angelica.anderson.wrvj@statefarm.com (business e-mail).
3. On or about October 6, 2017, the Department issued to Respondent a license as an insurance producer, National Producer Number 18559058.
4. On March 16, 2018, the Department notified Respondent by mail at her mailing address of record that her fingerprint card had been processed and returned by the Arizona Department of Public Safety (DPS) as illegible. The Department requested a replacement set

1 of fingerprints along with a completed "Illegible Fingerprint Replacement Form" on or before
2 April 6, 2018. Respondent did not reply to the Department's request.

3 5. On April 17, 2018, the Department notified Respondent a second time by mail at
4 her business address of record that her fingerprints had been returned by DPS as illegible and
5 that the Department was about to initiate an administrative action against her license for failure
6 to comply with the fingerprint requirement. The Department requested a response by May 4,
7 2018.

8 6. On April 26, 2018, the United States Postal Service delivered returned mail to
9 the Department from Respondent's business address with a label stating, "Return to Sender,
10 No Such Number, Unable to Forward."

11 7. On August 10, 2018, the Department notified Respondent again by mail at her
12 mailing address of record that her fingerprints had been returned by DPS as illegible and that
13 the Department was about to initiate an administrative action against her license for failure to
14 comply with the fingerprint requirement. The Department requested a response by August 22,
15 2018.

16 8. To date, Respondent has not submitted a full set of fingerprints to the
17 Department.

18 **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

19 1. The Director has jurisdiction over this matter.

20 2. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes the violation of the
21 requirement that an applicant submit a full set of fingerprints to the Department within the
22 meaning of A.R.S. § 20-285(E)(2).

1 3. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes the violation of any
2 provision of A.R.S. Title 20 or any rule, subpoena or order of the Director within the meaning
3 of A.R.S. § 20-295(A)(2).

4 4. Grounds exist for the Director to suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew
5 Respondent's insurance license, impose a civil penalty and/or order restitution pursuant to
6 A.R.S. §§ 20-295(A) and (F).


7 **ORDER**

9 1. Respondent may surrender her insurance producer license, National Producer
10 Number **18559058**.

11 2. The hearing, Docket #18A-125-INS, scheduled for **September 17, 2019, at 1:00**
12 **p.m.** is vacated.

5 Director is solely to settle this matter against her and does not preclude any other agency,
6 officer, or subdivision of this state including the Department from instituting civil or criminal
7 proceedings as may be appropriate now or in the future not related to this matter.

8 5. Respondent acknowledges that this Consent Order is an administrative action
9 that the Department will report to the National Association of Insurance Commissioners
10 (NAIC). Respondent further acknowledges that she must report this administrative action to
11 any and all states in which she holds an insurance license and must disclose this
12 administrative action on any license application.
