**ORDER** 

On March 29, 2019, the Office of Administrative Hearings, through Administrative Law Judge Thomas Shedden, issued an Administrative Law Judge Decision ("Recommended Decision"), received by the Director of the Department of Insurance ("Director") on March 29, 2019, a copy of which is attached and incorporated by this reference. The Director of the Department of Insurance has reviewed the Recommended Decision and enters the following Order:

- The Director adopts the Recommended Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommended Order.
- The Director revokes the Arizona resident insurance producer license of Joseph Keith Haugen, National Producer Number 18225532, effective immediately.

#### **NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS**

Pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes ("A.R.S.") § 41-1092.09, Respondent may request a rehearing with respect to this order by filing a written motion with the Director of the Department of Insurance within 30 days of the date of this Order, setting forth the basis for relief under A.A.C. R20-6-114(B). Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1092.09, it is not necessary to request a rehearing before filing an appeal to Superior Court.

1 Respondent may appeal the final decision of the Director to the Superior Court of 2 Maricopa County for judicial review pursuant to A.R.S. § 20-166. A party filing an appeal 3 must notify the Office of Administrative Hearings of the appeal within ten days after filing 4 the complaint commencing the appeal, pursuant to A.R.S. § 12-904(B). ## **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. On January 29, 2019, the Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") issued a Notice of Hearing setting the above-captioned matter for hearing at 1:00 p.m. March 26, 2019 at the Office of Administrative Hearings.
- 2. Respondent Joseph Keith Haugen did not appear at the scheduled time and the matter was convened in his absence at about 1:20 p.m.<sup>1</sup>
- 3. The Department presented the testimony of its Aqueelah Currie, its licensing supervisor.
- 4. Mr. Haugen holds license No. 18225532. Mr. Haugen's license is due to expire on August 31, 2020.
- 5. On June 26, 2017, Mr. Haugen was indicted for various crimes.
- 6. On June 13, 2018, Mr. Haugen was found guilty of Taking the Identity of Another, a class 4 felony, and of Theft, a class 3 felony. Among other things, Mr. Haugen was sentenced to serve twelve months in the county jail.
- 7. Mr. Haugen did not report to the Department that he had been convicted of the two felonies within thirty days of the convictions. The Department learned of the convictions through a notification from the Superior Court.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The Office of Administrative Hearings' docket shows that on March 27, 2019, Mr. Haugen telephoned OAH and informed the office that he is incarcerated and he provided an updated address.

- 8. After learning of Mr. Haugen's convictions, the Department attempted to contact him by telephone, email, and by mailing letters to his home and businesses address of record, but it received no response.
- 9. The Department considers Mr. Haugen's criminal convictions to be of great concern because insurance producers have access to people's personal information, including social security numbers.
- 10. The Department considered Mr. Haugen's failure to respond to its attempts to contact him to be a concern because it shows that he may not be amenable to regulation.
- 11. The Department requests that Mr. Haugen's license be revoked.

# **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The Department bears the burden of persuasion. ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 41-1092.07(G).
- 2. The burden of proof at an administrative hearing falls to the party asserting a claim, right or entitlement. The standard of proof is that of the preponderance of the evidence. ARIZ. ADMIN. CODE § R2-19-119.
- 3. A preponderance of the evidence is:

The greater weight of the evidence, not necessarily established by the greater number of witnesses testifying to a fact but by evidence that has the most convincing force; superior evidentiary weight that, though not sufficient to free the mind wholly from all reasonable doubt, is still sufficient to incline a fair and impartial mind to one side of the issue rather than the other.

BLACK'S LAW DICTIONARY 1373 (10th ed. 2014).

- 4. Mr. Haugen was required to report to the Department that he had been convicted of a felony within thirty days of the conviction, but did not do so, which is a violation of ARIZ. REV. STAT. sections 20-301 and 20-295(A)(2), and grounds on which the Department may discipline his license.
- 5. Mr. Haugen has been convicted of two felonies, for which the Department may discipline his license. ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 20-295(A)(6).

6. Considering the nature of Mr. Haugen's felony convictions, Mr. Haugen's license should be revoked.

### **ORDER**

**IT IS ORDERED** that Joseph Keith Haugen's license number 18225532 is revoked.

In the event of certification of the Administrative Law Judge Decision by the Director of the Office of Administrative Hearings, the effective date of the Order will be the date of that certification.
