Respondent.

The State of Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") has received evidence that **John T. Lynch**, **Jr. ("Respondent")** violated provisions of Title 20, Arizona Revised Statutes. Respondent wishes to resolve this matter without the commencement of formal proceedings, and admits the following Findings of Fact are true, and consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On February 26, 2019, Respondent submitted an Application for an Individual Producer License (the "Application") with lines of authority in accident & health or sickness, life and variable life and variable annuity insurance.
- 2. Respondent answered "Yes" to the Background Question of the Application that asks: 2. "Have you ever been named or involved as a party in an administrative proceeding, including FINRA sanction or arbitration proceeding regarding any professional or occupational license or registration? 'Involved' means having a license censured, suspended, revoked, canceled, terminated; or being assessed a fine, a cease and desist order, a prohibition order, a compliance order, placed on probation, sanctioned or surrendering license to resolve an administrative action. 'Involved' also means being named as a party to an administrative or arbitration proceeding, which is related to a professional or occupational license, or registration. 'Involved' also means

having a license or registration application denied or the act of withdrawing an application to avoid a denial"... "If you answer yes, you must attach to this application: a) a written statement identifying the type of license and explaining the circumstances of each incident, b) a copy of the Notice of Hearing or other document that states the charges and allegations, and c) a copy of the official document, which demonstrates the resolution of the charges or any final judgment."

- 3. Respondent disclosed an Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions Pursuant to Sections 15(b) and 15B(c) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Section 9(b) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, United States of America before the Securities and Exchange Commission, Administrative Proceeding File No. 3-17902, In the Matter of John T. Lynch, Jr.
- 4. Respondent failed to disclose a Final Judgment and Order, In the Matter of a Non-Member of the State Bar of Arizona, John T. Lynch, Jr., State Bar Nos. 16-2568 and 17-2087 based on the unintentional but mistaken belief that the question in the application did not pertain in that he did not have an Arizona law license and did not hold himself out as an Arizona attorney. However, he did, in fact, consent by agreement to a reprimand by the Arizona State Bar based on the facts as presented.
 - 5. Respondent responded "Yes" to the Attestation section of the Application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Director has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Respondent's conduct, as described above, constitutes providing incorrect misleading, incomplete or materially untrue information in the license application, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-295(A)(1).
 - 3. Grounds exist for the Interim Director to suspend for not more than twelve

months or revoke Respondent's insurance producer license, pursuant to A.R.S. § 20-295(A).

4. Grounds exist, in addition to or instead of any suspension, revocation or refusal to renew a license, for the Director to impose a civil penalty of not more than \$250.00 for each unintentional failure or violation, up to an aggregate civil penalty of \$2,500.00, or impose a civil penalty of not more than \$2,500.00 for each intentional failure or violation, up to an aggregate penalty of \$15,000.00, pursuant to A.R.S. § 20-295(F).

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. **John T. Lynch**, Jr., shall immediately pay a civil money penalty of \$250.00 for deposit into the State General Fund.

- 5. Respondent states that no promise of any kind or nature whatsoever, except as expressly contained in this Consent Order, was made to induce him to enter into this Consent Order and that he has entered into this Consent Order voluntarily.
- 6. Respondent acknowledges that the acceptance of this Consent Order by the Director is solely to settle this matter against him and does not preclude any other agency, officer, or subdivision of this state including the Department from instituting civil or criminal proceedings as may be appropriate now or in the future not related to this matter.
- 7. Respondent acknowledges that this Consent Order is an administrative action that the Department will report to the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC). Respondent further acknowledges that he must report this administrative action to any and all states in which he holds an insurance license and must disclose this administrative action on any license application.
