The Respondent submitted a written request for a review of this matter alleging that a portion of finding number 5. was incorrect. It appears that the premium which the complainant, Robert Whitehead, paid to the Respondent was in fact returned since no insurance policy was issued.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- The finding of fact paragraph 5. of the June 30,
 1982 Order is amended to read as follows:
 - "5. Mr. Whitehead, as a result of the Respondent's negligence, suffered damages of at least One Thousand Forty-eight Dollars and 64/100 (\$1,048.64), which is the approximate low bid for the repairs to the premises. To date, the Respondent has made no effort to pay the amount of damages incurred."
- 2. The Director's Order of June 30, 1982 is amended as follows:
 - "1. The Respondent's broker's license is hereby revoked. The Respondent shall surrender his broker's license to the Licensing Division of the Department of Insurance on or before September 30, 1982.

2. The Respondent's agent's license is suspended until the damages suffered by the complainant, Robert Whitehead, have been paid or Mr. Whitehead has been reimbursed. The suspension shall commence September 30, 1982 and shall continue, for not longer than twelve (12) months, until proof of the satisfaction of the damages for reimbursement has been submitted to the Department. The Respondent shall deliver his license to the Licensing Division of the Department of Insurance on September 30, 1982.

3. The Respondent shall forfeit and pay to the Director the sum of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) on or before September 30, 1982."

THIS MATTER HAVING regularly come on for hearing on the 16th day of June, 1982 before JEFFREY P. LARSON, Chief Hearing Officer for the Department of Insurance, and the Department being represented by Susan Lagerman, Assistant Attorney General, and the Respondent appearing in person, and testimony and evidence having been submitted, it is found as follows:

- 1. The Respondent is a licensed agent.
- On or about January 12, 1982, Mr. Robert Whitehead 2. wrote a check to the Richard Bredahl Agency as and for insurance premium on Mr. Whitehead's business and home. This check was deposited in Mr. Bredahl's account and subsequently forgotten.
- On March 3, 1982, Mr. Whitehead had a loss at his business. Mr. Whitehead subsequently contacted Mr. Bredahl to report the loss and inquired regarding a settlement of the claim. Mr. Bredahl represented that the claims adjuster was delayed and that deductibles would have to be paid, when in fact the policy had no deductible. Mr. Whitehead eventually called Statewide Insurance Agency through which Mr. Bredahl had brokered this Mr. Whitehead then discovered that he had no insurance and that his loss was not covered.
 - On April 26, 1982, Mr. Bredahl admitted by a letter

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to Mr. P. J. McKirchy, Investigator with the Department of Insurance, that there was no coverage for his failure to remit the premiums to the insurer.

5. Mr. Whitehead, as a result of the Respondent's negligence, suffered damages of at least One Thousand Forty-eight Dollars and 64/100 (\$1,048.64), which is the approximate low bid for repairs to the premises. It also appears that the premium paid has not yet been returned to Mr. Whitehead. To date, Respondent has made no effort to reimburse the premium paid or pay the amount of the damages suffered.

IT IS CONCLUDED as a matter of law that grounds exist to suspend or revoke the Respondent's insurance license or impose a monetary forfeiture, or both, for illegally withholding money belonging to a policyholder received in and during the conduct of business under the licenses, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes, Section 20-316.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. The Respondent's insurance licenses are revoked.
- 2. Any appeal of this matter must first be preceded by a written request for a review or rehearing made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.
