The Respondent did not appear at the hearing, either in person or by counsel. Evidence and testimony were submitted and it is found as follows:

- 1. At the time of the alleged violations, the Respondent was a licensed insurance agent.
- 2. In April, 1983 the Respondent received approximately fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500) for aviation insurance from Milton Coggins.
- 3. The Respondent failed to forward the premium to either his general agent or the insurance company.
- 4. On or about December 13, 1983 the Respondent accepted one thousand ninety-five dollars (\$1,095) as an additional premium from Coggins.
- 5. The Respondent also failed to forward this premium to either his general agent or an insurance company.

Grounds exist to suspend or revoke the Respondent's insurance license for misappropriating or converting to his own use monies belonging to a policyholder in violation of A.R.S. § 20-316.

) NOTICE OF HEARING

Motions to continue this matter shall be made in writing not less than five (5) business days prior to the date set for the Hearing.

A.R.S. § 20-164, entitles any person affected by such a hearing to appear in person and by counsel to be present during the giving of all evidence, to have a reasonable opportunity to inspect all documentary evidence to examine witnesses, to present evidence in support of its interest and to have subpoenas issued by the Director to compel attendance of witnesses and production of evidence in its behalf.

This hearing is being called by the Director because he is informed and has probable cause to believe that on or about April 4, 1983, Respondent accepted approximately

\$1,500.00 as insurance premium for aviation insurance with Security Insurance Group from Milton D. Coggins, Jr. It is further alleged that Respondent failed to forward said premium to either Security Insurance Group or Duncanson & Holt/Aerospace Managers Agency, Inc. and that such failure constitutes misappropriation, conversion and/or illegal withholding of monies belonging to policyholders, insurers, beneficiaries or others and received in or during the conduct of business under the license or through its use in violation of A.R.S. § 20-316(A)(4). Upon such a finding, the Director may suspend, revoke or refuse to renew the Respondent's insurance license, impose a monetary forfeiture upon the Respondent, or both, pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 20-316(A) and 20-316(C).

It is further alleged that the above-described conduct constitutes conduct of affairs under the license showing the Respondent to be incompetent or a source of injury and loss to, or repeated complaint by, the public or any insurer in violation of A.R.S. § 20-316(A)(7). Upon such a finding, the Director may suspend, revoke or refuse to renew the Respondent's insurance license, impose a monetary forfeiture upon the Respondent, or both, pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 20-316(A) and 20-316(C).

It is further alleged that on or about December 12, 1983, Respondent accepted approximately \$1,095.00 as additional insurance premium for the above-described aviation policy with
