ORDER

Petitioner.

On October 29, 1993, a hearing was held in the above-captioned matter. Petitioner was not present nor was he represented at the hearing. The Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") was represented by Assistant Attorney General Kathryn Leonard.

Based upon the evidence and arguments presented at the hearing, the Director and the Hearing Officer make the following findings of fact and conclusions of law and enter the following order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Notice of this hearing was mailed to Petitioner at his last address of record.
- 2. An Amended Notice was later mailed to Petitioner, but was mailed to the wrong apartment number. The Amended Notice was not returned by the post office.
- 3. On or about March 3, 1993, Petitioner submitted an original application for a property and casualty insurance agent's license with the Department.
- 4. Petitioner disclosed in his license application that in August, 1991, he was convicted of driving while intoxicated, in the town of Gilbert. Petitioner also disclosed that in May, 1992, he was convicted again of driving while

intoxicated, in Scottsdale. Petitioner is currently on Adult Probation for these offenses.

- 5. Petitioner was granted a conditional insurance license as a property and casualty agent in the State of Arizona, license number 14421. This license expires August 31, 1994.
- 6. After further investigation, the Department learned Petitioner failed to disclose several other arrests and convictions on his license application.
- 7. On or about May 17, 1983, Petitioner was arrested in Phoenix, Arizona for trespassing, a misdemeanor. Petitioner was convicted and ordered to serve one (1) day incarceration.
- 8. On or about October 26, 1985, Petitioner was arrested in Scottsdale, Arizona for firing a weapon within city limits, a misdemeanor. Petitioner was convicted and fined \$40.00.
- 9. On or about January 11, 1986, Petitioner was arrested in Phoenix, Arizona for driving while intoxicated.
- 10. On or about April 1, 1986, Petitioner was convicted in Phoenix, Arizona of driving while intoxicated and fined.
- 11. On or about January 6, 1987, Petitioner was arrested in Mesa, Arizona for assault.
- 12. On or about September 29, 1987, Petitioner was rebooked for aggravated assault involving a weapon.
- 13. On or about March 1, 1988, Petitioner was convicted in CR87-09134, of endangerment based on the assault arrests, a class 6, undesignated offense. Petitioner was

ordered to serve 30 days in jail and placed on supervised probation.

- 14. On or about April 2, 1992, Petitioner was arrested in Tempe, Arizona for facilitation to commit forgery, a class 1 misdemeanor.
- 15. On or about August 13, 1993, Petitioner was convicted in Maricopa County Superior Court, State v. Philip Terry Baker, No. CR92-03191, of facilitation to commit forgery, a class 1 misdemeanor. Petitioner was incarcerated in the Maricopa County Jail for six (6) months, ordered to pay a mandatory assessment fee of \$33.00 and placed on 3 years probation.
- 16. On or about September 13, 1993, Petitioner was advised by letter of the revocation of his conditional insurance agent's license and the denial of his application for a property and casualty agent's license.
- 17. On or about October 1, 1993, Petitioner requested a hearing based on said denial.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Director has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to A.R.S. §20-142.
- 2. Notice of this hearing was proper pursuant to A.R.S. §§20-163 and 41-1061.
- 3. Petitioner made material misrepresentations in the application for, or attempt to obtain, an insurance license, in violation of A.R.S. $\S20-290(B)(1)$.
- 4. Petitioner has a record of dishonesty in business or financial matters, in violation of A.R.S. §20-290(B)(2).

- 5. Petitioner wilfully misrepresented facts required to be disclosed in an application, in violation of A.R.S. $\S 20-291(G)$.
- 6. Grounds exist to deny Petitioner's insurance license application pursuant to A.R.S. §§20-290(B)(1), 20-290(B)(2) and 20-291(G).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

Revoking Petitioner's conditional license and denying Petitioner's application for a property and casualty insurance agent's license.

The aggrieved party may request a rehearing with respect to this Order by filing a written petition with the Hearing Officer within 30 days of the date of this Order, setting forth the basis for such relief pursuant to A.A.C. R4-14-114(B).
