This matter was heard on the 5th day of November, 1987, at which hearing testimony was presented regarding the availability of insurance coverage in the admitted and surplus lines markets for medical malpractice, professional liability, automobile physical damage for cement and sand and gravel trucks, automobile physical damage for custom motorhomes, rail road protection liability, or any other kind of coverage, not readily procurable from authorized insurers. It appears from a study done by the Department, of which the Director takes notice, that there are a few insurers which will write these coverages. However, the Director concludes the coverage is not procurable from a substantial number of insurers authorized to transact those kinds of insurance.

The Director finds that the list of recognized surplus lines adopted on October 8, 1985, an amended on December 26, 1986, should be further amended to include the following coverages:
